Depreciation: A Provider's Nightmare or a Deduction Bonanza?

Do you love claiming depreciation on your tax return? Few family child care providers do and it's not surprising why this is true. Depreciation involves a series of very complicated rules that allow you to deduct expenses associated with your business that cost more than \$100.

Claiming depreciation expenses involves complex calculations year after year as well as keeping records of these expenses for as long as 39 years! Here are a list of a few of the items you can depreciate and how long you must depreciate them for:

Office equipment (computer, printer, copier, etc.) - 5 years

Personal property (table, couch, bed, television, washer, dryer, refrigerator, playground equipment, etc.) - 7 years

Land improvements (fence, patio, driveway, etc.) - 15 years

Home improvements (new furnace, remodeling, new deck, etc.) - 39 years

Home - 39 years

Some providers (and some tax professionals) don't bother claiming depreciation because they don't think all the record keeping is worth it. This is a mistake. Let's look at an example: If you buy a \$1,000 couch for your living room (that is used in your business) and your Time-Space percentage is 40%, the business portion of the couch is \$400. You must depreciate this couch over 7 years and doing so will result in a business deduction each year of about \$57. This might save you about \$17-\$22 in taxes

Depreciation: A Provider's Nightmare or a Deduction Bonanza?

each year. In the first year this might not seem like a lot, but over 7 years you will save \$120-\$160 in taxes.

Note: if you bought a new couch in 2009 there is a new rule that allows you to claim a much higher deduction of about \$228 in 2009 instead of \$57! It's called the Additional 50% special depreciation allowance. What's more important to focus on is that you probably have many, many items in your home that you can depreciate. When you total up all of these items it can make a big difference in lowering your taxes.

In 2009 the IRS issued a revised Child Care Provider Audit Technique Guide that makes it much clearer that providers are entitled to claim depreciation for their household items. In particular the guide says that providers can depreciate items owned by them before they went into business. This includes potentially hundreds of household items, not just items that cost more than \$100. (A copy of the guide is posted in the Business Center at www.nafcc.org.)

Let's look at two situations:

A new provider opens her business in January 2010. In her home she has hundreds of items that she bought before her business began but now is using in her business. This includes large items such as furniture, appliances, computers, etc., but also many other household items such as pots and pans, toys, rugs, lamps, lawn mower, snow blower, bedding, CDs, pictures on the wall, tools, and so on. All such household items purchased before the business began, including those originally costing less than \$100, can be depreciated. Therefore, new providers should conduct an inventory of everything in their home that they are using in their business. Count everything! Write down each item and estimate what it is worth at the time the business began. The NAFCC online store sells the Family Child Care Inventory-Keeper that makes this job much easier. For example, if you estimated that all of your stuff was worth \$10,000 and your Time-Space percentage was 40%, the business portion would be \$4,000. When you depreciate this over 7 years your deduction will be about \$570 per year. Not bad!



Experienced Providers

If you have been in business for a few years and have not claimed depreciation on the household items you owned before your business began, it's not too late to do something about it! You can still claim all your previously unclaimed depreciation as long as you still own the items and used them for your business this year. Do the same inventory of not only the stuff you bought before you went into business but also anything you bought costing over \$100 after you went into business that you didn't depreciate. This may also include home improvements, or even the home itself. You always want to depreciate your home because of the large deduction!

After completing your inventory, do the same estimating of the value of the items when they were first used in your business. Calculate how much depreciation you were entitled to claim for all the years that you didn't, and put the total amount on Form 3115 Application for Change in Accounting Method. Then file this form with your tax return.

There is no limit on how many years you can go back and claim this depreciation so it could represent a very large deduction. For example, if your business began in 2000, using the \$10,000 example above you

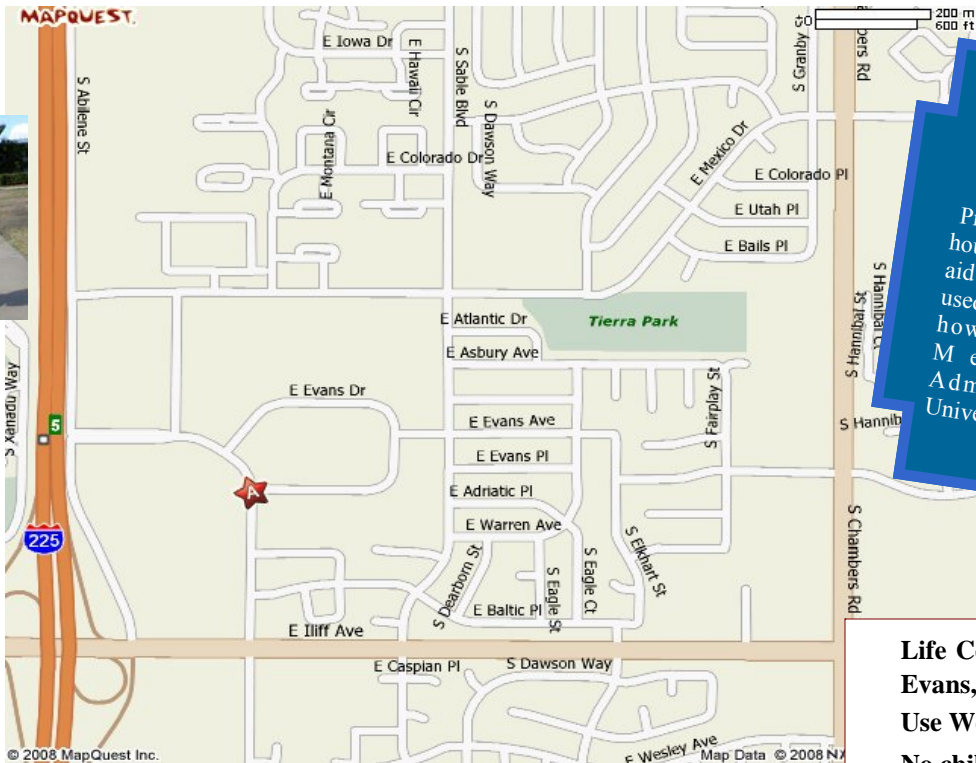

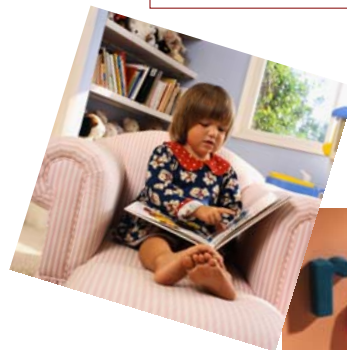

would be able to claim \$4,000 on your current year's tax return! This is because it's been more than 7 years since you used the items in your business and you would have fully depreciated by now if you had started in 2000.

Get Help

Don't let the complication of depreciation prevent you from taking advantage of these rules. Use the Family Child Care Record Keeping Guide to help you identify the many household items you can depreciate. If you do your own taxes, use the annual Family Child Care Tax Workbook and Organizer that has a chapter on depreciation and another on Form 3115. Both books are available from www.nafcc.org. If you use a tax professional prepare the inventory of items and let that person do the depreciation calculations.

Clarifying a Misunderstanding Regarding New Rules & Regulations

When the new rules and regulations came out, many providers attended trainings around the state with child care specialists from the Division of Child Care.

Within this class licensed providers were erroneously told that if they received their license PRIOR to May 1, 2007, they would need to take a 15 hour “pre-licensing class.” The term “pre-licensing” we were told later was an error.

We will update our members when the course is developed.

Response from Rosemarie Allen, Director, Division of Child Care to clarify this:

I have convened a group of Home Providers, Presidents of Family Child Care Associations and a representative from the National Family Child Care Association to develop the curriculum for this training. I am expecting a draft early Fall. The training will be available by the first of the year, if not before that time. This will be the only accepted training to meet the requirement.
